OUR ACCOMPLISHMENTS

- Share/Highlight some key accomplishments.
 - Increase in Education Quality from 91.7% to 96.6%.
 - Increase in Parental Involvement from 83.3% to 94.3%
 - Increase in Student Engagement from 78.6% to 96.6%. This illustrates that all our strategies from the past two years have worked.
 - We ran a successful student council during the 2022/2023 school year, thereby improving student voice.
 - o Increase in satisfaction with Indigenous learning opportunities from **64% to 89.5%.** This shows that our strategies of using the 7 Grandfathers Teachings, bringing in special guests and running Indigenous stations on special days worked.

ENGAGING OUR COMMUNITY

- Student success is a collective endeavor.
- We encourage staff, students, and parents to provide feedback and response to surveys as we strive to make data-informed decisions.

COMMENTARY ON OUR RESULTS (PUTTING IT INTO CONTEXT)

- This is the first time since 2019 that Westlake had enough parent responses for the Provincial Assurance survey that their input could be factored in.
- To improve our results for Welcoming, Caring, Respectful and Safe Learning Environments and student resiliency we are implementing social emotional classes and teaching students different strategies to deal with stress.
- Majority of students went up at least two Fountas and Pinnell reading levels. We are working to improve students' literacy abilities with the implementation of UFLI, LLI, Notice and Note and other literacy strategies.
